# Fukushima Mental Care Center Area Liaison Conference

The conference is held annually and is a valuable opportunity during which we report our activities in the Soma Area, and directly receive feedback from prefectural and municipal officers in charge of supporting disaster victims. This time, 21 participants attended the conference. We value all the feedback and will do our best to apply them in our future activities. (Kijima)



#### **Fukushima Mental Care Center: Reporting Session**

In December, a reporting session of the entire Fukushima Mental Care Center was held. The projects on alcohol-related issues, which the entire center is intensively working on, were reported. Each regional center from Aizu, Northern Fukushima, Central/Southern Fukushima to Iwaki also presented prominent topics of the year. Nagomi is in charge of the Soma Area. We reported our main activities of this year, focusing on support for the youth and men, the Millenniums Meet Up and Men's Gathering, respectively. (Kawamura)

#### Reflecting on the Lecture on Disaster Nursing

In July, I gave a lecture on disaster nursing at Mie Prefectural College of Nursing. I discussed the theme "survivors' guilt" from the viewpoint of a supporter who has survived the disaster. At the time of the disaster, some people evacuated from the affected area, fearing radioactive contamination while others decided to stay on. Nobody knew what the right choice was, but we all had to make a decision. It was an intense situation. However, as time has passed, less and less people talk about that period. I put aside my memories of the incident as well, thinking that it was useless to talk about the past, and I did not want to be thought of as a victim. After the lecture, I received feedback from the students. Five years have passed since the disaster. The feedback reassured me that now is the time to talk about my own experience as a survivor. #### **Support Activities for Preventing Isolation**

In November, at a meeting of the Japan Health and Welfare Policy Society, we presented Nagomi's initiatives for mid-to-long-term support after the disaster, supporting the youth and preventing isolation of middle-aged and elderly men. We also discussed important issues concerning regeneration of communities. One participant gave an encouraging remark that Nagomi was a cutting edge example, especially regarding support activities for the youth in Japan. (Fushimi)

## **Reporting Our Activities on Alcohol-Related Issues**

A meeting of the Japanese Society of Alcohol-Related Problems was held in Akita in September. I participated in one of the sectional meetings on "Suicide and Alcohol", and talked about "Dealing with Alcohol-related Health Issues in Disaster Areas". I discussed our activities during the time of the Fukushima Medical University Mental Care Team, subsequent visiting programs, and current alcohol-related projects. #### **Seminar on Case Studies**

We exchanged information on four Dementia Centers (space for patients with dementia, two in Soma, one in Minamisoma and another in Kumamoto). We discussed their activities, characteristics, and the challenges they face. As many residents have evacuated from the affected areas after the disaster, they have a shortage of applicants, and the local employment situation has been unstable. On December 3<sup>rd</sup>, we went to help the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Party of the Coffee Time. The Coffee Time is a social welfare office, which evacuated from Namie-machi after the disaster, and reopened in Nihonmatsu, Fukushima. The board chair, Hashimoto has supporting us ever since the launching of our organization despite herself being displaced by the disaster. During the ceremony, we



had a memorial lecture, and the members of the Coffee Time performed on stage. Eleven graduates of our Volunteers' Training Course came to help, and enjoyed our time together.
