MI (Motivational Interviewing) Workshop

On February 16, Soma Wide Area Care Center held an "MI (Motivational Interviewing) Workshop – Motivational Interview which we can started today", as part of the area's Anti-Alcohol Dependence Reinforcement Operation of Fukushima Mental Care Center. Dr. Kensuke Saito and Dr. Kazuhiro Kaneda of Tohoku-kai Clinic, Sendai City, Miyagi Prefecture were invited as lecturers. 21 supporters including Public Health Nurses from the local health centers participated in the Workshop. Motivational Interview is an interviewing method, as an example, whereby supporters work together with alcoholics and motivate them to collaborate in their behavior to stop drinking. In many cases alcoholics tend to be distanced from

their family and friends and become isolated. When the supporters' feelings wishing the alcoholic to improve their health is highlighted, the supporters' tend to strongly feel that they want make the alcoholics stop drinking. In Motivational Interviewing, we studied the method of acknowledging the ambivalence (conflicting emotions) of honestly wanting to stop but is not able to stop, and how to help guide their feelings toward "wanting to stop".
